**World Rabies Day** is an international initiative to raise awareness about the impact of a fatal but neglected disease. More than 55,000 people worldwide die from rabies every year—mostly in Asia and Africa—yet rabies in humans is 100% preventable through prompt medical

care. Uncontrolled dogs are the the main source of rabies and children are often at greatest risk. In North America, rabies is primarily a wildlife issue and human cases are very rare. Still, pet vaccination and wildlife safety remain an important part of our continuing public health.

**Veterinary and human health professionals will join pet and wildlife advocates to address local and global issues of rabies prevention and control.**
