

# 2023 SNAPSHOT



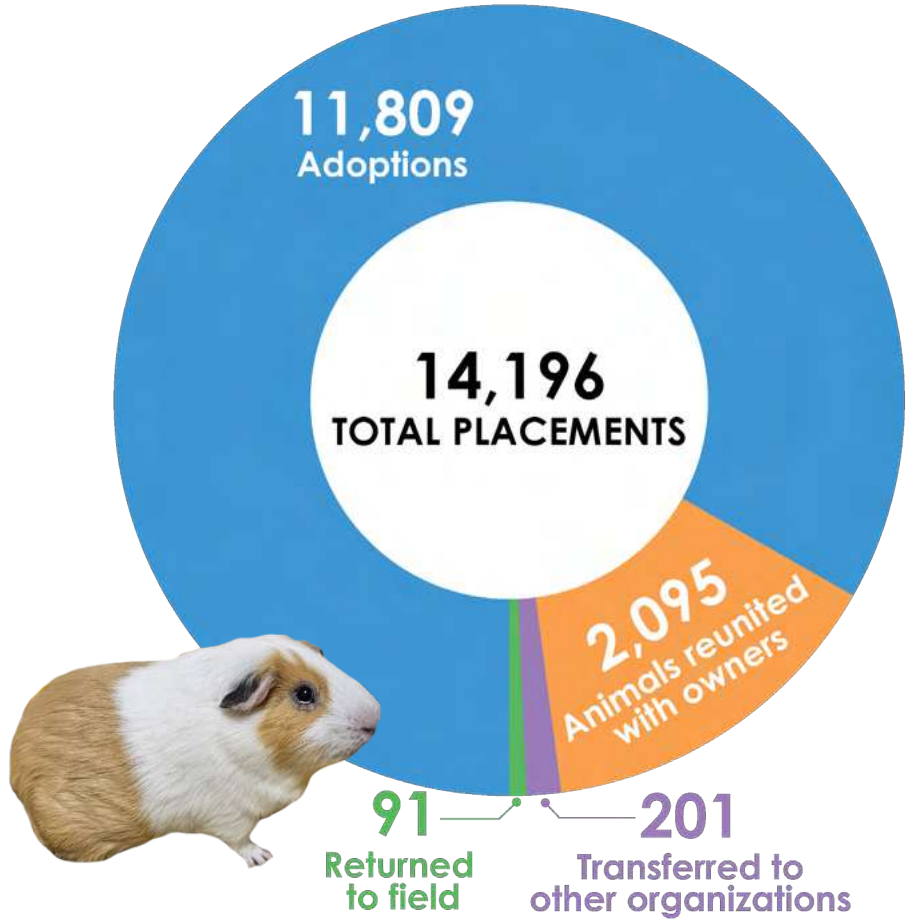

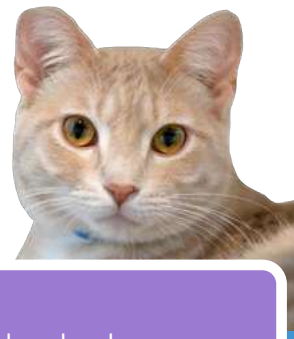

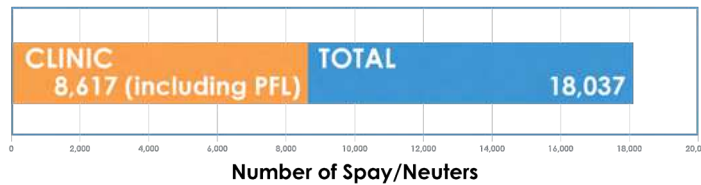
